SJU Pastor Transition Update

from Debbie Parker, Chair of Council

"What is happening to secure a new pastor after Pastor Mary Ka leaves SJU at the end of January?" Council and SPRC are hearing this question from around the congregation – and understandably so! In response, here is where we are:

- Rev. Tanya Wade has been named SJU's liaison with the Baltimore Presbytery Commission on Ministry (COM) for our transition to a called pastor to replace Pastor Mary Ka. Rev. Wade is the pastor of Grace Presbyterian Church in Baltimore City, and previously served as Christian Education Director at SJU.
- Rev. Wade is collaborating with Council and SPRC to provide information on, and assistance with, the Presbyterian pastor transition process.
- Council voted at its December 18 meeting to secure an interim pastor during
 the search for a called pastor, as the search for a called pastor may take as
 much as one year. Interim pastors are trained to help congregations transition
 from one pastor to another, as well as serve as pastor to the church until a
 pastor is called to serve on an ongoing basis.
- COM is currently working to identify interim pastor candidates for consideration by SJU.
- Rev. Lon Chesnutt, SJU Pastor Emeritus, will replace Pastor Mary Ka as the
 pastor investment trustee for SJU's building fund investment account. Debbie
 Parker, Lisa Cooper Green, and Andrew Love will continue as the other three
 investment trustees.
- Pastor Mary Ka's last day in the pulpit will be January 7. A reception will follow in the lobby.
- Pastor Mary Ka will moderate the SJU Annual Congregation Meeting on January 21. It will be her last official duty with SJU.
- After January 7, the following people will serve in the pulpit through the end of January:
- ▶ January 14 Guy Moody, Chair of SPRC and SJU representative to Baltimore Presbytery
- January 21 Jackie Taylor, General Presbyter
- January 28 Rev. Stephen Price-Gibson, PC(USA)

We will have more information to share throughout January as the process moves forward, so stay tuned!

Columbia Community Care (updated 11-12-23)

Did you know that:

- The CCC pop-up pantries serve an average of 300 families during their two-hour operation at the WLIFC on Saturday mornings?
- Many of the recipients of these non-perishable items are individuals who are employed but are unable to purchase sufficient food to support their families. They turn to CCC and other pantries to support their families with adequate food?
- The contributions from the WLIFC congregations represent 40% to 60% of the materials distributed by Columbia Community Care?
- The average weekly contribution of 162 items (May Oct 2023) has been falling since 2021 when we had an average weekly contribution of 672 items?

We hope you will consider increasing your contributions to the WLIFC totes. <u>During the Thanksgiving season</u>, totes and boxes will be available in the lobby and outside the WLIFC office during services on <u>Thanksgiving Day</u>.
