What is this project? St. John Catholic Church is sponsoring a **WLIFC project funded by the WLIFC Board** and invites participation from the St. John United community to "adopt" a parking lot island to plant with native plants.

Volunteers will be provided with all the plants and instructions for getting the native plants the best start in the islands. By adopting the islands, participants will be asked to water the islands throughout the summer and weed the space when necessary.

MESSAGES FROM HOWARD COUNTY GOVERNMENT

Aging-In-Place Tax Credit: Eligibility for the tax credit requires a minimum age of 65 years old, and at least 30 years, as of June 30th preceding the tax year, residing in a dwelling with an assessed property value up to \$650,000.

Retired service members of the United States Armed Forces with 20 years of active service, or their surviving spouses, are also eligible for the credit. However, the surviving spouse must not be remarried.

The number of years qualifying individuals may receive the credit is eight years. The credit will automatically renew unless the homeowner is no longer eligible. Applications for the <u>Aging-in-Place credit</u> for tax year 2024 (July 1, 2024- June 30, 2025) <u>will be available on March 1st</u>. The deadline to apply is June 30, 2024.

Columbia Community Care (updated 1-5-24)

The contributions of **non-perishable items** from Saint John the Evangelist Roman Catholic Church and St John United Church congregations at the WLIFC are greatly appreciated! For calendar year 2023, an estimated total of 13,728 items were contributed to Columbia Community Care from the WLIFC congregations through the office totes and WLIFC lobby. This compares to 17,297 items in CY2022 and 34, 306 items in CY2021. <u>CCC and other groups find that in the months after the holiday season there is an increasing need for basic groceries and personal care items.</u>

The CCC pop-up pantries serve an average of 300 families during their two-hour operation on Saturday mornings. These **non-perishable** food items are essential for the hundreds of families who have come to rely on the CCC pantries for weekly support. The season of need is always with us!
