Stay Well and Keep Others Well This Season!

SJU Pastor Transition Update

from Debbie Parker, Chair of Council February 9, 2024

Please be sure to come to the **February 11 worship service**, in person or online, to welcome and hear **Rev. Dr. Renee Mackey as she starts her 8-week tenure with us as bridge pastor** while we arrange for an interim pastor. She is excited to be with us part-time through Easter, March 31 to lead worship, provide crisis pastoral care, oversee staff, and be a resource to Council. By way of introduction, she provides this brief bio:

"I was born and raised in the Midwest and taught school in Denver, Colorado where I earned a Master's Degree in Library Science. God then called me into ministry first as a Ruling Elder and then as a Teaching Elder. I served three churches, one in Iowa and two in Maryland. I received my Doctor of Ministry Degree from Austin Theological Presbyterian Seminary and served Baltimore Presbytery as Moderator. I was honored to represent the Presbytery at the 221st General Assembly as commissioner and am now helping churches with pastoral leadership as needed."

As you hear and read about our pastor transition, it may help to clarify the difference between a bridge pastor, an interim pastor, and a called pastor. Let's work backward:

- A called pastor is the pastor that is called by the congregation to serve as its official pastor. When a
 Presbyterian minister is to be called, the Nominations and Personnel Committee of the church proposes,
 and the congregation approves, a Pastor Nominating Committee comprised of several members of the
 church to conduct the pastor search with assistance by Baltimore Presbytery.
- An interim pastor serves the church during the time between the departure of the outgoing pastor and the beginning of the called pastor's term. Council is currently working with Baltimore Presbytery to secure an interim pastor in the next few months.
- A bridge pastor may be called by Council to serve a short time until an interim pastor can be found or is available. In our case, Rev. Mackey has agreed to serve as bridge pastor from February 5 through Easter, March 31 to help bridge the expected gap until an interim pastor is in place at SJU.

NOTE: Rev. Tanya Wade is SJU's Commission on Ministry Liaison with Baltimore Presbytery. She is the pastor of Grace Presbyterian Church in Baltimore. She is not our bridge, interim, or called pastor.

As the saying goes, ask and you shall receive! After much feedback regarding the YPM Listening Session, the event has been **rescheduled to Sunday**, **Feb 25th at 6:30pm** and it will be a virtual Listening Session. Bishop Easterling really wants to meet the young people where they are, so she will hold it virtually so that youth and young adults can participate with their groups or individually from the comfort of their churches, couches, fellowship halls or wherever their hearts desire. The YPM Listening Session will be structured in a way so that our young people can share their hopes, dreams and what they see as the biggest needs in their communities. Youth will not be expected to have read and processed the <u>Survey Data Report</u> (which is asked of folks attending the other Listening Sessions), but instead will be invited into a conversation that empowers them to think big, share without hesitation, and brainstorm the best way to achieve their hopes for their communities. Columbia Community Care (updated 1-5-24)

The contributions of **non-perishable items** from Saint John the Evangelist Roman Catholic Church and St John United Church congregations at the WLIFC are greatly appreciated! For calendar year 2023, an estimated total of 13,728 items were contributed to Columbia Community Care from the WLIFC congregations through the office totes and WLIFC lobby. This compares to 17,297 items in CY2022 and 34, 306 items in CY2021. CCC and other groups find that in the months after the holiday season there is an increasing need for basic groceries and personal care items.

The CCC pop-up pantries serve an average of 300 families during their two-hour operation on Saturday mornings. These **non-perishable** food items are essential for the hundreds of families who have come to rely on the CCC pantries for weekly support. The season of need is always with us!
